When we ask questions in the present tense, most verbs need a helping verb.

Use **do** with **I**, **you**, **we**, or **they**. Use **does** with **he**, **she**, or **it**.

To answer the questions, use **do** or **does**.

To answer with a negative, use **not** after **do** or **does**.

The contraction of **do not** = **don't**.

The contraction of **does not** = **doesn't**.

Do you want steak?

Yes, I do.

Do you want salad?

No, I don't.
