Verb + Infinitive

- To form the infinitive, add *to* to the base form of a verb.
- Infinitives can follow many verbs. For example:
decide expect hope learn
need plan want agree

Verb + Gerund

- To form the gerund, add *-ing* to the base form of a verb.
- Gerunds can follow many verbs. For example:
avoid discuss dislike enjoy
finish keep practice

Verb + Infinitive/Gerund

- We can use some verbs with either the gerund or the infinitive. For example:
begin like love hate
prefer start try
